# ne almighty pull for Beams from local heroes





A group of 36 determined individuals from the Welling and Bexleyheath community have raised an incredible £2000 for We Are Beams by successfully pulling a 32-tonne truck a staggering two miles from Welling to Bexleyheath.

The incredible feat of strength and determination took place as part of the Uniformed Services Day relebrations. Over 5000 spectators lined the streets to witness this incredible display of community pulling together.

The event was the brainchild of Barry Saunders from Welling Town Business Associates, who was inspired to support We Are Beams after visiting the sixbedded respite unit and learning about the support Beams provide for disabled children in the local area.

# Caitlyn's Story

Caitlyn, 15 was born extremely premature at just 26 weeks. As a result of a severe brain bleed and other complications, she now faces multiple challenges, including cerebral palsy, epilepsy, visual impairment, autism, sleep disturbances and severe learning difficulties.

Her condition requires 24/7 care, leaving her parents exhausted and limited in their ability to spend time with her sister Hollie who is 10 years old. Caitlyn's additional needs significantly affect the family's daily life, making it difficult to plan outings or enjoy family time.

The family were referred to Beams by their social worker, and for the last few years Caitlyn has enjoyed day trips to the farm and the seaside, providing much-needed respite for her parents. Additionally, Caitlyn's time at Dragon's Retreat overnight respite has been crucial for the family's well-being. These short breaks allow Caitlyn's parents to catch up on sleep, recharge and spend quality time with Hollie.

Caitlyn is happy at Dragon's Retreat and this has enabled the family to plan activities that are enjoyable for Hollie.

Most importantly, Caitlyn has shown increased happiness and independence during her time at Beams which as a teenage is so important for her

There is so much love within the family for Caitlyn and although they face significant challenges and, an uncertain future due to Caitlyn's complex medical needs, with Beams by their side, the family strive to maintain a positive and fulfilling life

Caitlyn's mum Gina is so grateful to Beams and their vital care services.

"Without the support from Beams absolutely dread to think where we would be! We have been in crisis before and it was not a good time for us. Beams has given us much needed respite, we are able to plan activities that Caitlyn could not cope with and I am reassured knowing the staff are more than capable of meeting Caitlyn's needs."
